China's data privacy and security landscape has been developing rapidly over the past five years. However, given the complexity and volume of laws, proposed bills and standards, multinational organizations serving the region often lack a clear picture of China's data protection regime. In 2020, Chinese legislators made significant progress towards creating a comprehensive system of data protection by running a round of consultations for the proposed Personal Information Protection Bill (PIPL) and the Draft Data Security Law. This webinar by the Centre for Information Policy Leadership will provide an overview of China's data protection landscape, take a deeper look at the similarities and differences between the PIPL and the GDPR, discuss strategies for compliance with China's complex data privacy framework and consider the AI regulatory landscape in China.

21:45 The Developing AI Regulatory Landscape

As one of the world leaders in AI, it is not surprising that the Chinese government has called on legislators to draft regulations targeting AI and other new technologies. In August 2020, China issued the National Next Generation Artificial Intelligence Standards System Development Guidelines which specify that China is aiming to complete preliminary research for more than 20 AI standards by 2021. In addition, the National Information Security Standardization Technical Committee recently published Guidelines for Ethical Security Risk Prevention of AI. A leading academic in the region will provide an overview of the developing AI landscape in China.
