**Phase 1:** Develop white paper with CIPL members (part I), focusing on scope of AI Project.

- March 28: AI project committee meeting to review draft and provide further input (Washington, DC)
- April: First discussion draft of AI White Paper
- June 1: White paper (part I) completed

**Phase 2:** Discuss with regulators/policy makers; Complete white paper (part II).

- June 27: Meeting of all interested members at CIPL Special Retreat with APPA Regulators (San Francisco)
- September – October: Small group meetings with key regulators (e.g. DC, London, Europe)
- October 22 – 26: Side event to ICDPPC (Brussels)
- November 16: AI workshop (Singapore)
- December 15: White paper (part II) completed
