

How the "Legitimate Interests" Ground for Processing Enables Responsible Data Use and Innovation

Summary of Recommendations for Regulators and Policy Makers on the Legitimate Interest legal basis (LI)

- 1. Acknowledge that there is no hierarchy among different legal bases
- 2. Emphasize that organizations must rely on the most appropriate legal basis
- 3. Do not adopt an overly restrictive interpretation of the LI
- 4. Acknowledge that the LI promotes risk-based organizational accountability
- 5. Confirm that the LI enables a robust level of protection for individuals
- 6. Do not automatically exclude certain types processing activities from the LI
- 7. Confirm that individual right to object may be unsuitable in certain situations
- 8. Recognize that the LI is relevant for routine and innovative data processing activities
- 9. Refrain from asking organizations to publish their LI assessments
- **10.** Acknowledge that **mitigating measures impact the balancing of interests** of the controller, third parties, society and individuals
